

RESTORATION OF CIVIL RIGHTS

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, it is represented to me as Governor of Kentucky that Lonnie Osborne, Sr. DOB: 7-27-1944, was tried and convicted of the charge (s) of Trafficking in a Controlled Substance 2nd degree (2 counts) in the Menifee Circuit Court (X) or United States District Court () and was sentenced by said court to serve a term of five years probated for five years; and;

WHEREAS, the said Lonnie Osborne, Sr. was sentenced on April 1, 2004, and the period of probation was terminated on April 1, 2009; and;

WHEREAS, the said Lonnie Osborne, Sr. has made application to have his/her civil rights restored;


NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Sections 145 and 150 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, I, Steven L. Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby and now restore the right to vote and hold public office denied by judgement of conviction aforesaid and any prior conviction, to the said Lonnie Osborne, Sr. and direct all officials of the Commonwealth to be governed accordingly. This order only restores the right to vote and hold public office and does not restore any other civil right including but not limited to the right to receive, possess or transport in commerce a firearm or to serve on a jury.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have caused this order to be made patent, and the Seal of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to be hereto attached.
