AN ACT relating to motor vehicle license plates.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

1 ➔Section 1. KRS 186.041 is amended to read as follows:

2 (1) Each initial and renewal application by a person who meets the criteria of paragraph

3 (a) of this section and each initial application by a person who meets the criteria of

4 paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section for a special military license plate shall be

5 accompanied by proof that the person is associated with the United States Army,

6 United States Navy, United States Air Force, United States Marine Corps, United

7 States Coast Guard, United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, Kentucky National

8 Guard, Merchant Marines with service between December 7, 1941, and August 15,

9 1945, or Civil Air Patrol in one (1) of the following ways:

10 (a) An active component member;

11 (b) A retired member; or

12 (c) A veteran who received a discharge under honorable conditions, or the
13 veteran's widow and:

14 1. Performed twenty-four (24) months of active-duty service;

15 2. Received an early release due to injuries or other medical condition, or
16 at the convenience of the service;

17 3. Received a hardship discharge;

18 4. Was separated or retired due to a disability; or

19 5. Was determined to have a service-connected disability incurred during
20 the enlistment.

21 (2) The member, retired member, veteran, or reservist may purchase *an unlimited*
22 *number of* ~~two (2)~~ special military-related license plates *described in subsection*
23 *(1) of this section*, annually for vehicles they own or lease. A disabled veterans
24 license plate shall expire on July 31.

25 (3) A recipient of the Distinguished Service Cross, Navy Cross, or Air Force Cross

1 shall be eligible for a Service Cross license plate upon submission of an application
2 to the Kentucky Department of Veterans' Affairs. The recipient shall be required to
3 include with the initial application for a Service Cross license plate a copy of the
4 general order that authorized the award and the recipient's Department of Defense
5 form number 214. The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall verify the
6 documentation submitted with the application for a Service Cross license plate, and
7 if the individual applying for the plate is confirmed to be a recipient of the
8 Distinguished Service Cross, Navy Cross, or Air Force Cross, the Department of
9 Veterans' Affairs shall submit the applicant's name to the Transportation Cabinet's
10 Division of Motor Vehicle Licensing not later than September 1 preceding the year
11 that the Service Cross license plate is to be initially issued or renewed. When the
12 Service Cross license plate is ready, the plate shall be sent to the county clerk in the
13 county of the applicant's residence. The Transportation Cabinet's Division of Motor
14 Vehicle Licensing shall inform each applicant in writing that the Service Cross
15 license plate is ready and may be picked up at the county clerk's office. The
16 Transportation Cabinet shall prescribe the type of application form required by this
17 subsection and shall supply the Department of Veterans' Affairs with the application
18 form required by this subsection.

- 19 (4) A person who is a former prisoner of the enemy during World War I, World War II,
20 the Korean War, or the Vietnam War, or the spouse of a deceased former prisoner
21 of war, shall be eligible for a former prisoner of war license plate by submitting
22 written proof from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or other
23 appropriate federal agency stating the period of time the person or person's spouse
24 was a prisoner of war. If a former prisoner of war dies with a vehicle licensed as
25 authorized under this section, the person's surviving spouse may retain the license
26 plate for use on the same vehicle or on another vehicle that complies with KRS
27 186.164(7).

1 (5) A person who is certified by the Kentucky chapter of the Pearl Harbor Survivors
 2 Association as being a survivor of the attack on Pearl Harbor shall be eligible for a
 3 Pearl Harbor license plate and shall be required to attach to the special military-
 4 related license plate application written evidence from the Kentucky chapter of the
 5 Pearl Harbor Survivors Association that the person:

- 6 (a) Was a member of the United States Armed Forces on December 7, 1941;
 7 (b) Was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45
 8 a.m., Hawaii time, at Pearl Harbor, the island of Oahu, or offshore at a
 9 distance not to exceed three (3) miles;
 10 (c) Was discharged honorably from the United States Armed Forces; and
 11 (d) Is certified by the Kentucky chapter of the Pearl Harbor Survivors
 12 Association.

13 (6) A person who is eligible to receive a Gold Star Mothers, *Gold Star Fathers*, or
 14 Gold Star Spouses license plate under KRS 186.164(15)(a) may receive up to two
 15 (2) Gold Star Mothers, *Gold Star Fathers*, or Gold Star Spouses license plates *free*
 16 *of charge and may purchase additional license plates by paying the same fee as*
 17 *for special military-related plates issued under subsection (2)(d) of Section 2 of*
 18 *this Act* annually for vehicles he or she owns or leases.

19 (7) The surviving spouse of a Kentucky National Guard member or a retired member,
 20 who possessed a vehicle licensed with the Kentucky National Guard special license
 21 plate, may retain the license plate for use on the same vehicle or another vehicle that
 22 complies with KRS 186.164(7). The surviving spouse may renew the license plate
 23 indefinitely, provided the appropriate registration fee is paid annually.

24 ➔Section 2. KRS 186.162 is amended to read as follows:

25 (1) As used in this section and in KRS 186.043, 186.164, 186.166, and 186.174:

- 26 (a) "Special license plate" means a unique license plate issued under this chapter
 27 to a group or organization that readily identifies the operator of the motor

1 vehicle or motorcycle bearing the plate as a member of a group or
 2 organization, or a supporter of the work, goals, or mission of a group or
 3 organization. The term shall not include regular license plates issued under
 4 KRS 186.240;

5 (b) "Street rod" means a modernized private passenger motor vehicle
 6 manufactured prior to the year 1949, or designed or manufactured to resemble
 7 a vehicle manufactured prior to 1949;

8 (c) "SF" means the portion of an initial or renewal fee to obtain a special license
 9 plate that is dedicated for use by the Transportation Cabinet;

10 (d) "CF" means the portion of an initial or renewal fee to obtain a special license
 11 plate that is dedicated for use by a county clerk; and

12 (e) "EF" means the portion of an initial or renewal fee to obtain a special license
 13 plate that is mandated by this chapter to be dedicated for use by a particular
 14 group or organization.

15 (2) The initial purchase fee and renewal fee for a special license plate created under this
 16 chapter shall be as established in this subsection and includes the name of group or
 17 organization and the total initial and renewal fee required for the plate. The amount
 18 in parentheses indicates how the total fee is required to be divided:

19 (a) Disabled veterans who receive assistance to purchase a vehicle from the
 20 United States Department of Veterans' Affairs, veterans declared by the
 21 United States Department of Veterans' Affairs to be one hundred percent
 22 (100%) service-connected disabled,~~[Veterans' Administration]~~ and recipients
 23 of the Congressional Medal of Honor:

24 1. Initial Fee: \$0 (\$0 SF/\$0 CF/\$0 EF).

25 2. Renewal Fee: \$0 (\$0 SF/\$0 CF/\$0 EF).

26 (b) Former prisoners of war and survivors of Pearl Harbor:

10 Guard; Merchant Marines who served between December 7, 1941, and August
11 15, 1945; persons who wish to receive Gold Star Mothers, Gold Star
12 Fathers, or Gold Star Spouses license plates beyond the two (2) exempted
13 from fees under subsection (6) of Section 1 of this Act; and disabled veterans
14 who have been declared to be between~~[at least]~~ fifty percent (50%) and
15 ninety-nine percent (99%) service-connected disabled by the United States
16 Department of Veterans' Affairs~~[- or who receive total service-connected~~
17 ~~disability rating for compensation on individual unemployability and have not~~
18 ~~received assistance from the United States Department of Veterans' Affairs~~
19 ~~toward the purchase of a motor vehicle];~~

7 2. Renewal Fee: \$25 (\$12 SF/\$3 CF/\$10 EF to the Association of
8 Independent Kentucky Colleges and Universities for distribution to the
9 general scholarship funds of the Association's members).

10 (v) Child Victims:

11 1. Initial Fee: \$38 (\$25 SF/\$3 CF/\$10 EF to the child victims'
12 trust fund established under KRS 41.400).

16 1. Initial Fee: \$38 (\$25 SF/\$3 CF/\$10 EF to the Kentucky

20 (x) Ducks Unlimited:

21 1. Initial Fee: \$38 (\$25 SF/\$3 CF/\$10 EF to Kentucky Ducks
22 Unlimited).

23 2. Renewal Fee: \$25 (\$12 SF/\$3 CF/\$10 EF to Kentucky Ducks
24 Unlimited).

25 (y) Spay neuter:

26 1. Initial Fee: \$25 (\$12 SF/\$3 CF/\$10 EF to the animal control
27 and care fund established under KRS 258.119).

1 county clerk who shall forward the EF fee to the cabinet. The cabinet shall remit EF
2 fees to the group or organization identified in KRS 186.162 on a quarterly basis.
3 The cabinet may retain any investment income earned from holding EF fees
4 designated to be remitted under this subsection to offset administrative costs
5 incurred by the cabinet in the administration of EF fees.

6 (2) A special license plate shall be the color and design selected by the group or
7 organization identified in subsection (13) of this section, contingent upon the
8 approval of the Transportation Cabinet. In addition to the design selected for a
9 special license plate, the name "Kentucky," an annual renewal decal, and any
10 combination of letters or numerals required by the cabinet in the design shall also
11 appear on the plate.

12 (3) Except as provided in KRS 186.162, the total initial fee for a special license plate
13 created under this chapter shall be twenty-eight dollars (\$28), of which the
14 Transportation Cabinet shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) and the county clerk
15 shall receive three dollars (\$3), and the total renewal fee shall be fifteen dollars
16 (\$15), of which the Transportation Cabinet shall receive twelve dollars (\$12) and
17 the county clerk shall receive three dollars (\$3). The twenty-five dollar (\$25) initial
18 fee and twelve dollar (\$12) renewal fee received by the Transportation Cabinet
19 under this subsection shall include an applicant's registration fee required under
20 KRS 186.050.

21 (4) An actual metal special license plate shall be issued on the same schedule as regular
22 license plates are issued under KRS 186.240. The cabinet shall have the discretion
23 to extend the time period that will exist between the date a metal special license
24 plate is issued and the date that regular plates are issued under KRS 186.240. A
25 renewal registration decal shall be issued all other years during the owner's or
26 lessee's birth month, except as provided in KRS 186.041(2), 186.042(5), and
27 186.174(2). A person seeking a special license plate for a vehicle provided as part

1 of the person's occupation shall conform to the requirements of KRS 186.050(14).

2 (5) (a) If a special license plate issued under this chapter deteriorates to the point that
3 the lettering, numbering, or images on the face of the plate are not legible, the
4 plate shall be replaced free of charge, if the owner or lessee has not transferred
5 the vehicle to which the plate was issued during the current licensing period.

6 (b) If a special license plate issued under this chapter is lost, stolen, or damaged in
7 an accident, the county clerk shall issue a new plate upon payment of a three
8 dollar (\$3) county clerk fee, if the owner or lessee has not transferred the
9 vehicle to which the plate was issued during the current licensing period.

10 (6) Upon the sale, transfer, or termination of a lease of a vehicle with any special
11 license plate issued under this chapter, the owner or lessee shall remove the special
12 plate and return it and the certificate of registration to the county clerk. The county
13 clerk shall reissue the owner or lessee a regular license plate and a certificate of
14 registration upon payment of a three dollar (\$3) county clerk fee. If the owner or
15 lessee requests, the county clerk shall reissue the special plate upon payment of a
16 three dollar (\$3) county clerk fee for use on any other vehicle of the same
17 classification and category owned, leased, or acquired by the person during the
18 current licensing period. If the owner or lessee has the special plate reissued to a
19 vehicle which has been previously registered in this state, the regular license plate
20 that is being replaced shall be returned to the county clerk who shall forward the
21 plate to the Transportation Cabinet.

22 (7) A special license plate may be issued to the owner or lessee of a motor vehicle that
23 is required to be registered under KRS 186.050(1), (3)(a), or (4)(a), except a special
24 license plate shall not be issued to a taxicab, airport limousine, or U-Drive-It
25 registered and licensed under this chapter or KRS Chapter 281. A person applying
26 for a special license plate shall apply in the office of the county clerk in the county
27 of the person's residence, except as provided in KRS 186.168(3). All special license

1 plates issued under this chapter may be combined with a personalized license plate
2 under the provisions of KRS 186.174. The fee to combine a special license plate
3 with a personalized license plate shall be as established in KRS 186.162(3).

4 (8) Within thirty (30) days of termination from election to, appointment to, or
5 membership with any group or organization, an applicant to whom a special license
6 plate was issued under this chapter shall return the special license plate to the
7 county clerk of the county of his or her residence, unless the person is merely
8 changing his or her status with the group or organization to retired.

9 (9) A group wanting to create a special license plate that is not authorized under this
10 chapter on June 20, 2005, shall comply with the following conditions before being
11 eligible to apply for a special license plate:

12 (a) The group shall be nonprofit and based, headquartered, or have a chapter in
13 Kentucky;

14 (b) The group may be organized for, but shall not be restricted to, social, civic, or
15 entertainment purposes;

16 (c) The group, or the group's lettering, logo, image, or message to be placed on
17 the license plate, if created, shall not discriminate against any race, color,
18 religion, sex, or national origin, and shall not be construed, as determined by
19 the cabinet, as an attempt to victimize or intimidate any person due to the
20 person's race, color, religion, sex, or national origin;

21 (d) The group shall not be a political party and shall not have been created
22 primarily to promote a specific political belief;

23 (e) The group shall not have as its primary purpose the promotion of any specific
24 faith, religion, or antireligion;

25 (f) The name of the group shall not be the name of a special product or brand
26 name, and shall not be construed, as determined by the cabinet, as promoting a
27 product or brand name; and

- 1 (g) The group's lettering, logo, image, or message to be placed on the license
2 plate, if created, shall not be obscene, as determined by the cabinet.
- 3 (10) If the cabinet denies to issue a group a special license plate based upon the
4 conditions specified in subsection (9) of this section, the group may appeal the
5 denial to the next regularly scheduled session of the General Assembly for review
6 of the denial and action on the group's request for a special license plate. The
7 cabinet shall, immediately upon denying to issue a group a special license plate,
8 notify in writing the chairperson of both the House and Senate Transportation
9 Committees of the General Assembly of the denial and the reasons upon which the
10 cabinet based the denial. The House and Senate chairpersons shall be required to
11 present the information to his or her respective committee for consideration within
12 the first ten (10) days of the next regularly scheduled session of the General
13 Assembly, if requested to do so in writing by the group who was denied a special
14 license plate. A person seeking a personalized license plate under KRS 186.174
15 shall be subject to the conditions specified in subsection (9)(c) to (g) of this section.
- 16 (11) If the cabinet approves a request for a special license plate, the cabinet shall begin
17 designing and printing the plate after the group collects a minimum of nine hundred
18 (900) applications with each application being accompanied by a twenty-five dollar
19 (\$25) state fee. The applications and accompanying fee shall be submitted to the
20 cabinet at one (1) time as a whole and shall not be submitted individually or
21 intermittently.
- 22 (12) An initial applicant for, or an applicant renewing, his or her registration for a special
23 license plate may, at the time of application, make a voluntary contribution that the
24 county clerk shall forward to the cabinet. The entity that sponsors a special plate
25 established by the process outlined in this section may set a requested donation
26 amount, not to exceed ten dollars (\$10), that will automatically be added to the cost
27 of registration or renewal, unless the individual registering or renewing the vehicle

1 registration opts out of contributing that recommended amount. The cabinet shall,
2 on an annual basis, remit the voluntary contributions to the appropriate group
3 identified to be used for the declared purpose stated under subsection (13) of this
4 section. The cabinet may retain any investment income earned from holding
5 voluntary contributions designated to be remitted under this subsection to offset
6 administrative costs incurred by the cabinet in the administration of the
7 contributions. Any group or organization that receives a mandatory EF fee under
8 KRS 186.162 shall submit the information required under subsection (13)(a) and (c)
9 of this section to the Transportation Cabinet within thirty (30) days of June 20,
10 2005.

11 (13) If a group wants to receive a donation when the group or organization's special
12 license plate is initially purchased or renewed under subsection (12) of this section,
13 the group shall, at the time the nine hundred (900) applications are submitted to the
14 Transportation Cabinet, also submit a notarized affidavit to the cabinet attesting to:

15 (a) The name, address, and telephone number for the group or organization. If the
16 group or organization does not have its headquarters in the Commonwealth,
17 then the name, address, and telephone number for the group or organization's
18 Kentucky state chapter shall be required. The names of the officers of the
19 group or organization shall also be required. If the entity receiving funds
20 under subsection (12) of this section is not a state governmental agency, a
21 program unit within a state governmental agency, or is a group or organization
22 that does not have a statewide chapter, then an extra donation for use by the
23 group or organization shall be prohibited;

24 (b) The amount of the monetary donation the group wants to receive when a
25 person purchases the group or organization's special license plate; and

26 (c) The purpose for which the donated funds will be used by the group or
27 organization. Donated funds shall not be limited for use by members of the

1 group or organization, and shall not be used for administrative or personnel
2 costs of the group or organization.

3 (14) All funds received by a group or organization under subsection (12) of this section
4 shall be deposited into an account separate from all other accounts the group or
5 organization may have, and the account shall be audited yearly at the expense of the
6 group or organization. The completed audit shall be forwarded to the Transportation
7 Cabinet in Frankfort. One hundred percent (100%) of the funds received by a group
8 or organization under subsection (12) of this section shall be used for the express
9 purpose identified by the group in subsection (13) of this section. Any group or
10 organization that receives a mandatory EF fee under KRS 186.162 shall comply
11 with the provisions of this subsection.

12 (15) The secretary of the Transportation Cabinet shall promulgate administrative
13 regulations under KRS Chapter 13A to establish additional rules to implement the
14 issuance of special license plates issued under this chapter, including but not limited
15 to:

16 (a) Documentation that will be required to accompany an application for a special
17 license plate to provide proof of election to the United States Congress or the
18 Kentucky General Assembly; election or appointment to the Kentucky Court
19 of Justice; membership in a Masonic Order, Fraternal Order of Police, or
20 emergency management organization; eligibility for membership in the Gold
21 Star Mothers of America; **eligibility as a father for associate membership in**
22 **the Gold Star Mothers of America**; eligibility for membership in the Gold
23 Star Wives of America; or ownership of an amateur radio operator license;

24 (b) The time schedule permissible for a group or organization to request a design
25 change for the special license plate; and

26 (c) The procedures for review of proposed license plates and the standards by
27 which proposed special license plates are approved or rejected in accordance

1 with subsection (9) of this section.

2 (16) Any individual, group, or organization that fails to audit any funds received under
3 this chapter, or that intentionally uses any funds received in any way other than
4 attested to under subsection (13) of this section or for administrative or personnel
5 costs in violation of subsection (13) of this section, shall be guilty of a Class D
6 felony and upon conviction shall, in addition to being subject to criminal penalties,
7 be assessed a mandatory five thousand dollar (\$5,000) fine.




