PARDON

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

WHEREAS, Christopher IIX of Louisville, Kentucky was convicted in Jefferson County Circuit Court in 1997 of theft by failure to make disposition, and in Kenton County Circuit Court in 1990 of possession of controlled substance; and

WHEREAS, Christopher IIX is a man with a heart for community service. He has turned his life around after a rocky start many years ago and he has paid his debt to society. In fact, he has paid that debt with dividends that continue to multiply and bless those with whom he interacts; and

WHEREAS, he is an upstanding citizen and it is my privilege to grant him the full and unconditional pardon that he has requested:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Matthew G. Bevin, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, in consideration of the foregoing, and by the virtue of the authority vested in me by Sections 77, 145, and 150 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby unconditionally pardon Christopher IIX a/k/a Christopher Anthony Bryant and return to him all rights and privileges of a citizen of this Commonwealth.
