TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN


WHEREAS, Amanda Dawn Hall of Louisville, Kentucky was convicted in Martin County Circuit Court in 2011 of complicity to trafficking and trafficking in controlled substance, and in 2009 of possession of drug paraphernalia; and

WHEREAS, Amanda Hall went through a dark period of addiction and resulting criminal activity. She has since turned her life around and is a true blessing to many in her community. She has paid her debt to society and continues to give back on multiple fronts; and

WHEREAS, it is my privilege to grant her the full and unconditional pardon that she has requested:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Matthew G. Bevin, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, in consideration of the foregoing, and by the virtue of the authority vested in me by Sections 77, 145, and 150 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby unconditionally pardon Amanda Dawn Hall and return to her all rights and privileges of a citizen of this Commonwealth.
