**TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN**


**WHEREAS**, Kurt Robert Smith was convicted in Fayette County Circuit Court in 2002 of murder; and

**WHEREAS**, Kurt Smith has been duly punished for his criminal actions more than eighteen years ago; and

**WHEREAS**, I hereby commute his sentence to time served and pardon him for his actions. I am confident that he will become a productive member of society and encourage him to use his life experience to educate and help others:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Matthew G. Bevin, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, in consideration of the foregoing, and by the virtue of the authority vested in me by Sections 77, 145, and 150 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby commute the sentence of Kurt Robert Smith to time served and simultaneously grant him a full and unconditional pardon and return to him all rights and privileges of a citizen of this Commonwealth.
